Charger Women Receive Twin Lakes Conference Honors

At the annual Softball banquet held Sunday evening (more on this next week), L-M head coach, Ashley Partlow, announced the 2007 Twin Lakes Conference honors.

Seniors Kelsey Meyer and Bryn Johnson headed the list as unanimous First Team selections. Joining them on the First Team were senior catcher, Brynn Larson and senior shortstop, Laci Hall.

Meyer (third base) batted a team-high .443 and set a new record for total hits/season at 51 (this happened to be a record held by older sister, Lindsey Meyer).

Johnson (pitcher) also set a record with 5 home runs this season ending the year hitting .417 with 12 doubles and 32 RBI.

Larson (catcher) closed out the season with a .291 batting average with 12 doubles, and 15 RBI to go along with a home run.

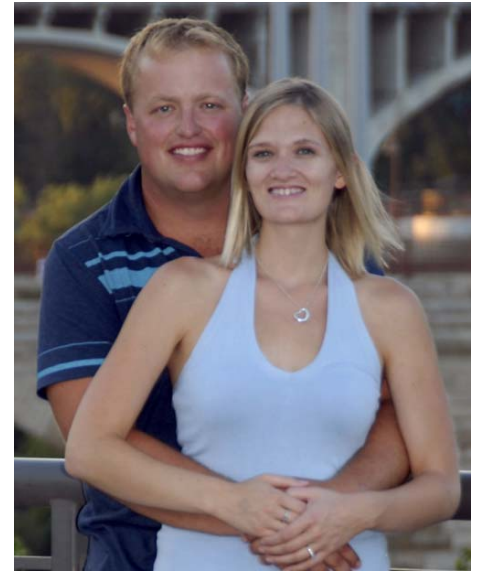

A Special Place

Iowa must have a few hundred small towns. Whatever that number is, in my mind, Laurens stands out as one very special place. This feeling, that grows stronger with the passing years, was reinforced a couple weeks ago when my family and I visited Laurens for its quasiquicentennial. On a morning jog around town, I saw examples that illustrated the community's extraordinary nature. The obvious friendliness of the natives, for instance -- something that's amazed my kids since their first visit to Laurens years ago. On my jog around town, every person I met greeted me. And every driver waved. By comparison, my kids grew up in places like Los Angeles and Washington D.C., where a wave from a passing stranger was something rarely experienced. In Laurens, that's the way people, whether friends or strangers, are treated. Sure, it's a small gesture. Yet it speaks volumes about the friendly, caring folks who live in my hometown.

Jogging east of town, I passed the town's cemeteries - hallowed ground that serves as the final resting place for many Americans that Tom Brokaw labeled "The Greatest Generation". Yet I knew them only as the hard-working pillars of the community-farming, running gas stations, dime stores, implement shops and other businesses. Little did I know of the sacrifices they and their families made to preserve our nation and the world. I was growing up among unsung heroes and didn't even know it. As an aside, the recently dedicated Military Veterans Memorial in Pocahontas does an exceptional job of documenting the sacrifices of these men. It's well worth a visit.

Proceeding around the town's parameter, I was amazed at the flourishing businesses. From light manufacturing to food distribution to grain elevators to thriving small businesses, Laurens is remarkably like the Energizer Bunny-it just

keeps going and going and going. And it does this while many small Midwest outposts are turning into ghost towns, slowly fading into the cornfields. In Laurens, there's economic vibrancy and that's a special tribute to the initiative and hard work of its citizenry.

Nearing the end of my run, I passed what I knew years ago as Laurens Consolidated School. Much has changed there, yet much remains the same. There are beautiful new facilities (although the old Work Projects Administration-built gym still holds some special memories for me) that I know will enable the school to continue to provide its students with the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in life. One need only look at the accomplishments of graduates who attended the Quasiqui's all-class reunion to be reminded of the quality education that's been provided for decades by the staff and teachers of the Laurens school system. Growing up in Laurens and attending that school are remarkable privileges. It's a tremendous head start for Laurens youth. I suspect many of the current students who are counting the days until they have to return to the classroom don't always appreciate the education they're receiving. But some day they will-I know I do.

During my career in the Air Force, my family and I have lived in cities that boasted of being among the most important in the world. Maybe so, but, in my view, the real strength of our nation is found in towns like Laurens. It's imbedded in the town's churches, businesses, farms and its school. But, as I was reminded so often during our most recent visit, the town's fiber is its people -- many of whom are my friends. They, most of all, make Laurens what it is-A Special Place. I always will remember and appreciate that. I hope you will too.

Didn't Get a Crock?

One Last Chance!

Never fear! You may still have a chance to order the Red Wing Stoneware quart-size crock that was sold to commemorate the Laurens Quasiquicentennial. This is a miniature replica of Red Wing's 35 gallon crock. One side of the crock features Red Wing Stoneware's logo, their famous red wing, and the number "35." On the other side is a logo with the script "Laurens, Iowa-est. 1881." The crock is approximately 5 inches in diameter and 5.5 inches tall.

To offer the same price (\$30) we offered with our initial order, we need to order at least 100 crocks. There will be



an additional cost if you choose to have your crock shipped to you.

At this time, we are making a list of people who are interested in buying crocks. If there is enough interest, we will then place an order. If you would like to have one or more crocks, send an e-mail message to: mary.runneberg@gmail.com. In your message, please include your name, phone number, the number of crocks you would like to buy, and an e-mail address where you frequently check messages. Once we have requests for at least 100 crocks, we will contact you with the information you need to order your crocks. If you don't use e-mail, please call 712-841-2007 and leave your name, phone number, and the number of crocks you would like to have.

We're not able to guarantee that you will receive your crocks by a certain date. The timing will be determined by the amount of time it takes to receive requests for at least 100 crocks and the number of orders Red Wing Stoneware has ahead of ours.

Wine 101

I have received many questions regarding wine. I will start this week by answering: Do I need to "decant" my bottle of French wine?

The answer to this is yes. Let me explain about letting your wine "breathe" or decant.

When we speak of letting a wine "breathe" it means allowing wines to be exposed to the air before serving. This increases and mellows the flavor of the wine. Red wine is the only one encouraged to "breathe". Both the youngest and the heaviest of the reds should be opened at least 1 1/2 hours before serving. Older and/or lighter reds should be opened about 1/2 hours before serving. Very old red wines are opened and drunk immediately. Many older wines are good for just a few minutes; they deteriorate rapidly when exposed to air.

Decanting means to pour the wine from the bottle into another container. The new container can be simple or ornate. Decanters for red wines have wide-mouth openings; they do not have covers or stoppers. Narrow-neck decanters with stoppers are intended for port or sherry.

You decant a wine for two reasons: It aerates the wine (exposes it to air - you don't need to let it "breathe" as long) which brings the flavor to life. Decanting also removes sediment...but usually only very old wines have sediment...or homemade wines!

I hope that this gives you some insight to your newly acquired bottle of French wine! May you share it with someone you love!

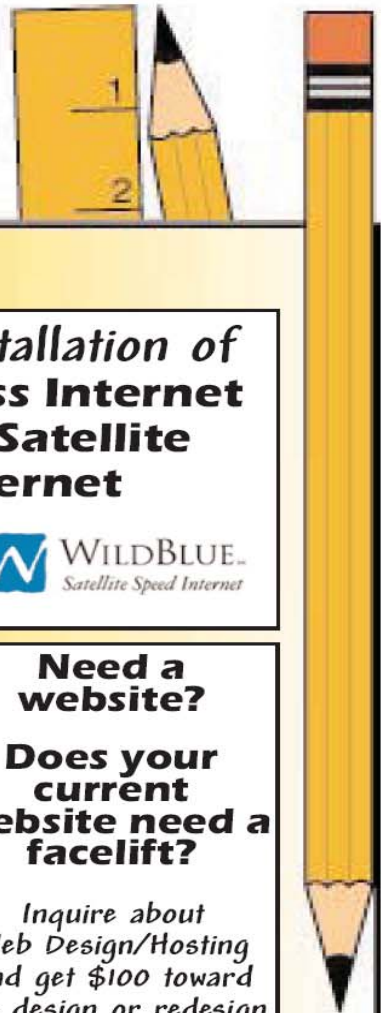

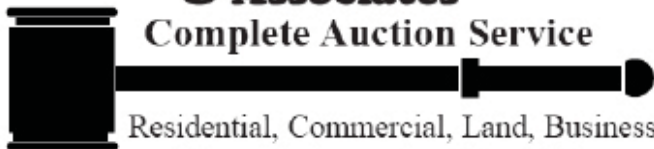
